2. <u>DNREC Buffer Proposal</u>

Marcia Fox with DNREC presented an overview of the new DNREC Buffer Initiative in the Chesapeake Bay Watershed. The program's goal is to increase the amount of riparian buffers along waterways (including ditches) as part of a larger water quality initiative. See program flyer at the end of the minutes for a summary of program qualifications and incentives. No action was required.

3. Tax Ditch Pilot Program

Wes Allen, Tax Ditch, Program Manager, gave an overview of the results of the first year of the Tax Ditch Pilot Program as well as recommendations for an additional five systems to be added to the program.

Received request to approve the following additional systems to be added to the tax ditch pilot program for 2023 along with two alternatives:

- Koeppel Robinson Tax Ditch
- Little Bay Tax Ditch
- Phipps Tax Ditch
- Meadow Branch Tax Ditch
- Bear Hole Tax Ditch
- Bucks Branch (alternate tax ditch)
- Jones Branch (alternate tax ditch)

Moved by Joe Booth and seconded by Will Carlisle to approve adding the named additional tax ditch systems and alternates to the program in 2023. Motion passed. (8 yes, 0 no)

4. Manchester Manor Bid Award

Received request to award bid to Common Sense Solutions for the Manchester Manor Drainage Improvement Project. Manchester Manor is a residential subdivision located east of Laurel off Chipman's Pond Rd. and the project involves reconstruction of much of the roadside swales, storm drain installation and improvements to the existing stormwater pond.

- Land must be connected or next to a stream/ditch.
- Agricultural buffer plantings will need to be a minimum of a 1/2 acre and urban buffer plantings will need to be a minimum of 1/4 acres.
- Farmers that lease agricultural lands are eligible but must certify an active lease.
- Applicants must be in good standing with the Nutrient Management Program or the Delaware Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation Program, if applicable.
- Must agree to keep the areas forested for a minimum of 5 years, with renewal for up to 10 years.

- One hundred percent of project costs are covered.
- Rental payment paid to landowner for 5 years. Receive rental in one-time payment.
 - Narrow forest width buffer < 35' =\$500
